# SHRIVER CHILDREN TIMELINE

Eunice Kennedy marries Robert S. (Sargent) Shriver after dating for nine years.

1954

April Robert S. ("Bobby") Shriver III, the first child of Eunice and Sargent Shriver, is

born on the 28<sup>th</sup> in Chicago, Illinois. (http://www.bobbyshriver.com/index.php)

1955

November Maria O. Shriver, the second child and only daughter of Eunice and Sargent

Shriver, is born on the 6<sup>th</sup> in Chicago, Illinois. **Maria Shriver** attends Westland

Middle School in Bethesda, Maryland.

1959

August Timothy P. Shriver, the third child of Eunice and Sargent Shriver, is born.

John F. Kennedy (JFK) is elected president.

1961 JFK appoints Sargent Shriver as the first director of the Peace Corps.

1963

November JFK is assassinated in Dallas. After speaking with RFK, EMK calls Rose

Kennedy and arranges to fly to Hyannis Port with Eunice Kennedy Shriver later that day. EMK and Eunice Kennedy Shriver tell JPK the next morning that JFK had been assassinated. RFK and Jean Kennedy Smith, meanwhile, stay with Jackie Kennedy and the children, and Sargent Shriver takes care of the funeral

arrangements. (Rose Kennedy, pp. 441-446; Clymer, pp. 52-53)

Lyndon B. Johnson (LBJ) is sworn in as president. Sargent Shriver joins the Johnson Administration, helping to create several War on Poverty programs, including Head Start and the Job Corps. (Bobby Shriver bio, http://www.bobbyshriver.com/im/bio content/2BobbyShirverBiography3.18.09.pdf)

1964

February EMK attends a benefit dinner organized by Eunice Kennedy Shriver for the

Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr., Foundation to help the mentally disabled. LBJ serves as

the dinner's speaker. (Rose Kennedy, p. 450)

Mark K. Shriver, the fourth child of Eunice and Sargent Shriver, is born.

June EMK's back is broken in a plane crash.

1965

July Anthony Paul K. Shriver, the fifth child of Eunice and Sargent Shriver, is born.

1968

March RFK announces his candidacy for president in 1968.

April Sargent Shriver is appointed U.S. Ambassador to France. He serves until 1970.

June After winning the California primary, RFK is shot in Los Angeles on the 5<sup>th</sup>. He

dies the next day. On the 8<sup>th</sup>, EMK delivers a powerful eulogy at RFK's funeral service at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. After the funeral, the Kennedys travel with the coffin by train to Washington, D.C. RFK is buried in Arlington National Cemetery. (Clymer, pp. 112-119; Rose Kennedy, pp. 475-476)

October Jackie Kennedy marries Greek shipping billionaire Aristotle Onassis. Jean

Kennedy Smith and Eunice Kennedy Shriver attend the ceremony in Greece. EMK does not attend. He stays behind to care for Ethel, RFK's widow, who almost loses her last child Rory during her seventh month of pregnancy. The rest

of the family, except Rose, supports the marriage. (Clymer, pp. 129-130)

December Eunice Kennedy Shriver founds the Special Olympics, an international

organization dedicated to helping people with intellectual disabilities succeed

through sports and other activities. (http://www.specialolympics.com)

1969

July Accident at Chappaquiddick.

November JPK dies after having a heart attack on the 15<sup>th</sup> and slipping into a coma. EMK

and Jackie Kennedy Onassis stay at his side during the final hours. EMK speaks for the family at the funeral, which is held at St. Francis Xavier in Hyannis Port on the 20<sup>th</sup>. JPK is buried in Holyhood Cemetery in Brookline, Massachusetts.

1972

July Sargent Shriver is named as George McGovern's running-mate in the 1972

presidential election after McGovern's first choice, Senator Thomas F. Eagleton (D-MO), is forced to withdraw, and EMK refuses the offer. McGovern chooses Shriver reportedly over EMK's objections. **Maria Shriver** volunteers for her

father's campaign. She later writes that, when she is sent to the back of the campaign plane with the press corps, it is "the best thing that ever happened to me," as it sparks her passion for broadcast journalism. (Wikipedia.com; Clymer, p. 190; *The New York Times*, 07/31/1972)

1973

JPK II is the driver in a jeep accident, his third car accident in a year, which leaves his younger brother David with a fractured vertebrae and David's girlfriend paralyzed. (Leamer, p. 180)

<u>Maria Shriver</u> graduates from high school, the Stone Ridge School of the Sacred Heart, in Bethesda, Maryland. (Wikipedia.com)

November

EMK learns that his twelve year old son, Teddy Kennedy, Jr., has cancer in his leg and that the leg will have to be amputated. Teddy begins a two-year, experimental methtrexate cancer treatment the following February.

On the 17<sup>th</sup>, Kathleen Kennedy marries David L. Townshend at Georgetown's Holy Trinity Church, hours after Teddy Kennedy's leg is amputated. EMK gives away the bride then rushes back to the hospital. (Mulvaney, pp. 86-89)

1974

Jean Kennedy Smith works with the John F. Kennedy Center for Performing Arts to found the National Committee, Arts for the Handicapped (NCAH). The NCAH is later renamed Very Special Arts and becomes an international organization providing cultural programs for the mentally and physically challenged. In 1981, Congress designates the NCAH as the nation's coordinating agency for arts programs for people with disabilities. (http://www.vsarts.org)

1976

Sargent Shriver makes an unsuccessful bid for the Democratic nomination for president. EMK reportedly does little to help him. (*Time*, 01/13/2001)

Tim Shriver and JFK, Jr. join Peace Corps volunteers to help earthquake victims in Guatemala.

Spring

Eunice Kennedy Shriver attacks the *Washington Star*, and defends EMK's family's privacy, after the newspaper reprints an article from the *National Enquirer* about Joan Kennedy's alcoholism and her time in rehab. (Clymer, p. 243)

Fall

Northern Ireland political leader John Hume accepts an associate fellowship at Harvard's Center for International Affairs. The Kennedy family hosts a reception in Hume's honor in Washington. During his stay Hume develops a close relationship with the Kennedy family, including EMK, Ethel Kennedy, Bobby Kennedy Jr., Jean Kennedy Smith, and the Shriver children. (Barry White, *John Hume Statesman of the Troubles*, Belfast: Blackstaff Press, 1984, p. 191; Andrew J. Wilson, *Irish America and the Ulster Conflict, 1968-1995*, Washington D.C.: Catholic University of America Press, 1995, p. 129)

1976?

<u>Bobby Shriver</u> graduates from Yale College at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut, with *cum laude* honors. Shriver begins a career in journalism, working for the Annapolis *Evening Capitol*, Chicago's City News Bureau, the Chicago *Daily News*, and the Los Angeles *Herald Examiner*, before deciding to attend law school. (Wikipedia.com)

1977

Tom Brokaw introduces <u>Maria Shriver</u> to bodybuilder Arnold Schwarzenegger at Eunice Kennedy Shriver's charity tennis tournament.

June

<u>Maria Shriver</u> graduates from Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., earning a bachelor of arts degree in American Studies. She goes on to begin her career in journalism working for KYW-TV in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. (Wikipedia.com)

December

EMK travels to China over New Years with a large group that includes his wife, Joan, his children, PJK, Kara Kennedy, and EMK, Jr., his sisters, Patricia Kennedy Lawford and Eunice Kennedy Shriver, his niece Caroline, his brother-in-law, Stephen Smith, his nephew, Michael Kennedy, and aides, Jan Kalicki and Carey Parker. (Clymer, pp. 261-266)

### 1979

Summer

After much discussion with family and friends, EMK decides to challenge Carter for the Democratic nomination and run for president in 1980. In making his decision, EMK had asked friend John Tunney and aide Larry Horowitz to speak with his children, who are concerned for EMK's safety. EMK also meets with a group of psychiatrists to discuss the possible effects a presidential campaign might have on Joan Kennedy. (Clymer, pp. 283-284)

November

Speaking from Boston's Faneuil Hall on the 7<sup>th</sup>, EMK officially announces his candidacy for the 1980 presidential election. Joan Kennedy announces that she will participate in the campaign. EMK places Stephen Smith in charge, and several other family members join the campaign. Rose Kennedy helps EMK campaign in Iowa. Kara Kennedy hands out leaflets in New York City. **Maria Shriver** quits her first job as a television producer to campaign for her uncle. Kathleen Kennedy Townshend travels the country nursing her infant daughter Megan. RFK, Jr., attends gay political meetings for EMK. EMK, Jr., campaigns much of the time with his father. Even twelve-year old PJK often travels with EMK. On at least two occasions PJK's chronic asthma flares up, and their campaign plane is diverted so he can get treatment. (Clymer, pp. 302-311)

### 1980

August

EMK withdraws his bid for the presidency in a speech at the Democratic National Convention. Commenting on his late entry into the campaign, EMK later says he

spent too much time "worrying about whether to run or not to run instead of what to do after I ran." (Clymer, p. 339)

1981

**Bobby Shriver** graduates from Yale Law School, after which he clerks for a year for Judge Stephen R. Reinhardt at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in California. Shriver then moves to New York to work in venture capital with the Wolfensohn firm. (Wikipedia.com)

January

EMK and Joan Kennedy announce on the 21<sup>st</sup> that they are getting divorced. Joan moves into the apartment in Boston; EMK continues living in McLean, Virginia.

June

More than one hundred Kennedy family members and friends attend a ceremony at the White House Rose Garden in which President Ronald Reagan awards Ethel Kennedy a Congressional Gold Medal honoring her late husband Robert F. Kennedy. (Clymer, p. 327)

### 1982

November

EMK meets with family members in Hyannis Port over Thanksgiving to make a final decision about entering the 1984 presidential race. Present at the meeting are EMK's children, Jean Kennedy Smith and Patricia Kennedy Lawford, JPK II and Stephen Smith, Jr., and Stephen Smith. Larry Horowitz organizes the session. EMK also talks with his sister Eunice Kennedy Shriver, who reportedly is the family's strongest advocate for another run. Following his children's wishes, EMK decides not to run. (Clymer, p. 3-8)

#### 1984

March

President Ronald Reagan awards Eunice Kennedy Shriver with the Presidential Medal of Freedom for her work with the mentally disabled. It is the highest honor awarded to a civilian. (http://specialolympics.com)

April

David Kennedy dies of a drug overdose in Palm Beach while visiting Rose Kennedy, along with several of his cousins, for Easter.

Rose Kennedy suffers a debilitating stroke. She spends much of the next year recovering at the family's home in Hyannis Port. (Clymer, p. 563; *The New York Times*, 07/23/1984)

1985-87

Maria Shriver co-anchors the CBS Morning News with Forrest Sawyer.

#### 1986

April

<u>Maria Shriver</u> marries Arnold Schwarzenegger on the 26<sup>th</sup> in Hyannis at St. Francis Xavier Roman Catholic Church after a seven year relationship. They go

on to have four children: Katherine, Christina, Patrick, and Christopher. (Mulvaney, p. 98; http://www.firstlady.ca.gov/about/)

May

Timothy Shriver marries Linda S. Potter in Washington, D.C. They have five children: Sophia, Timothy, Samuel, Kathleen, and Caroline. (Mulvaney, p. 111)

1987

**Bobby Shriver** produces a prime-time television feature for ABC about the Special Olympics, as well as the first of nine *A Very Special Christmas* records. Shriver goes on to form Special Olympic Productions to raise money for the Special Olympics through entertainment-related projects. (Wikipedia.com)

May

EMK travels to Poland with his three children, Jean Kennedy Smith, Eunice Kennedy Shrive, Patricia Kennedy Lawford, Ethel Kennedy, and five of RFK and Ethel Kennedy's children to present the Robert F. Kennedy Award to three Solidarity activists. Upon leaving Poland, EMK travels to Rome to discuss his experience in Poland with Pope John Paul II.

1987-89

<u>Maria Shriver</u> co-anchors NBC News' *Sunday Today* and weekend editions of *NBC Nightly News*.

1989

While a junior at Georgetown University, Anthony Shriver founds Best Buddies, a volunteer organization dedicated to enhancing the lives of people with intellectual disabilities by providing opportunities for one-to-one friendships and integrated employment. Anthony was close to his aunt Rosemary, who was mentally disabled. (http://www.bestbuddies.org/best-buddies)

April

EMK travels to Mexico with Jean Kennedy Smith, Stephen Smith, Eunice Kennedy Shriver, William Kennedy Smith, and several aides.

December

<u>Maria Shriver</u> gives birth to Katherine Eunice Schwarzenegger on the 13<sup>th</sup> in Los Angeles, California. <u>Maria Shriver</u> and Arnold Schwarzenegger raise their family in their home in the Pacific Palisades and, later, in Brentwood, California. On Sundays, they attend Mass at St. Monica's Catholic Church in Santa Monica. They own vacation homes in Hyannis and in Sun Valley, Idaho. (Wikipedia.com)

1989-93

**Bobby** and Sargent Shriver invest in the Baltimore Orioles with Eli Jacobs and Larry Lucchino. (Wikipedia.com)

1989-2004

Maria Shriver works as a contributing anchor on Dateline NBC.

1990

July

The Kennedy family celebrates Rose Kennedy's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. (Clymer, p. 473)

August

Steve Smith dies of cancer on the 19<sup>th</sup>.

1991

July

Spring William Kennedy Smith is charged with sexual battery in Palm Beach. EMK and PJK had been with Smith on the night in question and are later called to testify.

Maria Shriver gives birth to Christina Maria Aurelia Schwarzenegger on the 23<sup>rd</sup>

in Los Angeles, California. (Wikipedia.com)

October EMK gives an important speech at the Kennedy School of Government at

Harvard University in which he acknowledges that he has made mistakes in the

conduct of his private life.

1992

June Mark Kennedy Shriver marries Jeanne E. Ripp in Newport, Rhode Island. They

met at Holy Cross. They have three children: Molly, Tommy, and Emma. (http://www.huffingtonpost.com/mark-kennedy-shriver-and-julianne-moore)

July EMK and Vicki Reggie are married at EMK's home in McLean, Virginia.

1993 Maria Shriver appears as herself in her husband's movie, *Last Action Hero*.

March President Bill Clinton nominates Jean Kennedy Smith Ambassador to Ireland.

July Anthony Shriver marries Alina Mojica in Hyannis Port. They have four children:

Teddy (from Alina's previous marriage), Eunice, Francesca, and Carolina and live

in Miami. (Mulvaney, pp. 157-158)

September Maria Shriver gives birth to Patrick Arnold Shriver Schwarzenegger on the 18<sup>th</sup>

in Los Angeles, California. (Wikipedia.com)

**Bobby Shriver** produces the movie *True Lies*, which stars his brother-in-law,

Arnold Schwarzenegger. (Wikipedia.com)

May Jackie Kennedy Onassis dies in her home in New York.

Eunice Kennedy Shriver becomes the only living woman whose portrait appears

on a U.S. coin – the commemorative Special Olympics silver dollar.

January Rose Kennedy dies from complications of pneumonia, just a few months short of

her 105<sup>th</sup> birthday. EMK, Patricia Kennedy Lawford, Jean Kennedy Smith, and Eunice Kennedy Shriver gather in Hyannis Port to be with Rose Kennedy during

her final days.

1996 Timothy Shriver is named Chairman of the Special Olympics. Before joining the

Special Olympics, Shriver was a leading educator focusing on the social and

emotional factors in learning. He earned his undergraduate degree from Yale University, a Master's degree in Religion and Religious Education from Catholic University, and a Doctorate in Education from the University of Connecticut. (http://www.specialolympics.org/tim shriver.aspx)

### 1997

Maria Shriver gives birth to her fourth and final child, Christopher Sargent September Shriver Schwarzenegger, on the 27<sup>th</sup> in Los Angeles, California. (Wikipedia.com)

Michael Kennedy dies in a skiing accident in Colorado. He is survived by his wife December Victoria and their three children Michael Jr., Kyle, and Rory. (Mulvaney, p. 91)

July

2000

2002

The Kennedy family holds a reunion in Hyannis Port over the Fourth of July Summer weekend. Over 100 Kennedys attend. (*The Boston Herald*, 07/07/1998)

1999 U2 lead singer Bono, who is one of the artists to participate in A Very Special Christmas, asks **Bobby Shriver** to help with the Jubilee 2000 campaign to seek debt relief for the poorest countries around the world. Shriver and Bono go on to lobby Congress to increase funding for African debt relief. (Bobby Shriver bio)

> JFK, Jr. and his wife, Carolyn Bessette Kennedy, die in an airplane accident off the coast of Massachusetts. The couple had been traveling to Hyannis Port to attend the wedding of Rory Kennedy, RFK's youngest child. Lauren Bessette, Carolyn's sister, also dies in the accident. (Clymer, pp. 603-605; Heymann, p. 502; Anderson, p. 285)

> Maria Shriver's book, Ten Things I Wish I'd Known before I Went out into the *Real World*, is published.

2001 California Governor Gray Davis appoints **Bobby Shriver** as chairman of the California State Park and Recreation Commission. (Associated Press, 03/21/2008)

**Maria Shriver**'s book, *What's Wrong with Timmy?*, is published.

Mark Kennedy Shriver, who is a Democratic member of the Maryland House of Delegates, makes a bid for Congress from Maryland. He seeks to unseat popular Republican Congresswoman Connie Morella. EMK holds at least two fundraisers for him. (*Time*, 08/13/2001)

The NCAA rewards Eunice Kennedy Shriver with the Theodore Roosevelt award for her work with the Special Olympics. It is the highest honor awarded by the NCAA. (http://www.specialolympics.com)

1998

**Bobby Shriver** and Bono cofound DATA (Debt, AIDS, Trade in Africa), a multinational non-government organization created to fight AIDS and help poor countries in Africa. Shriver and DATA found the ONE Campaign in 2004 to help build support for DATA's lobbying goals. (Wikipedia.com; Bobby Shriver bio)

EMK celebrates his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday. Vicki Kennedy organizes birthday parties for February EMK in Washington, D.C., and Boston. (The Boston Globe, 02/22/2002)

November Mark Kennedy Shriver loses his bid to become a congressman from Maryland.

December Kara Kennedy is diagnosed with inoperable lung cancer and told she might have less than a year to live. EMK does not accept the diagnosis and helps Kara find a surgeon in Boston who removes a portion of her right lung in January 2003. The surgery is successful. She undergoes chemotherapy treatment in Boston and Washington, D.C. Her cancer goes into remission. (http://www.boston.com/)

2003 Sargent Shriver is diagnosed with Alzheimer's. (http://thehill.com/)

Arnold Schwarzenegger announces his candidacy in the 2003 California recall August election for Governor of California during an appearance on *The Tonight Show* with Jay Leno on the 6<sup>th</sup>. Maria Shriver takes an unpaid leave of absence from her position as a contributing anchor on *Dateline NBC*.

November Schwarzenegger is elected Governor of California, and Maria Shriver becomes California's First Lady. Shriver continues her work with NBC, making two more appearances for *Dateline NBC*, until she is told by NBC on February 3, 2004, that she is being relieved of her duties, citing conflict of interest. As First Lady, Shriver sets up a number of WE programs to fight poverty, help the disabled, promote community service, and build women's empowerment. (http://www.firstlady.ca.gov/about/; Wikipedia.com)

> California Governor Schwarzenegger reappoints **Bobby Shriver** chairman of the California State Park and Recreation Commission. Shriver had initially been appointed by Governor Gray in 2001. (Associated Press, 03/21/2008)

> **Bobby Shriver** runs for the Santa Monica City Council. He is elected by the highest percentage in the city's 120 year history. Shriver is active in the fight to reduce homelessness, particularly among veterans, and to clean up Santa Monica Bay. (Bobby Shriver bio)

**Maria Shriver**'s book, *What's Happening to Grandpa?*, is published.

2005 **Maria Shriver**'s book, *And One More Thing Before You Go...*, is published.

**Bobby Shriver** marries Malissa Feruzzi on the 7<sup>th</sup>. He becomes step-father to May Feruzzi's eight-year-old daughter, Natasha Lee. (Wikipedia.com)

2004

2006 **Bobby Shriver** and Bono co-found (Product) Red, a brand-licensing company, to raise money for The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. Shriver also serves as the company's CEO. (Wikipedia.com; Bobby Shriver bio)

> Joseph California's Family Day, a statewide effort to bring families together for day long activities. (http://www.wearefamily.ca.gov/)

2007 **Maria Shriver**'s book, *What's Heaven?*, is published.

> Maria Shriver returns to television news as a substitute host on Larry King Live in which she serves as moderator for a discussion on breast cancer. She later announces that she will not return to news media after the excessive coverage of the death of Anna Nicole Smith. (Wikipedia.com)

2008 Maria Shriver's book, Just Who Will You Be?, is published.

> **Bobby Shriver** is re-elected to the Santa Monica City Council. (http://www.bobbyshriver.com/index.php)

EMK publicly endorses Barack Obama. Maria Shriver is in attendance. January

> Schwarzenegger endorses Senator John McCain for the Republican presidential nomination on the 31<sup>st</sup>. (Wikipedia.com)

Maria Shriver endorses Obama for president on the 3<sup>rd</sup> during a rally at UCLA *February* featuring Caroline Kennedy, Oprah Winfrey, Stevie Wonder, and Michelle Obama. (Wikipedia.com)

> Maria Shriver opens an ice cream company called Lovin' Spoonful to benefit charities, including the Special Olympics. (http://www.firstlady.ca.gov/about/)

On the 17<sup>th</sup>, Kathleen Kennedy marries David L. Townshend at Georgetown's Holy Trinity Church, hours after Teddy Kennedy's leg is amputated. EMK gives away the bride then rushes back to the hospital. (Mulvaney, pp. 86-89)
