MONDAY, JULY 1, 1963

ROME, ITALY

9:40 am The President arrived at Fiumicino Airport. He was greeted by President Antonio Segni of Italy.

10:00 am The President, President Segni, Minister Sensi (acting as interpreter) departed Fiumicino Airport by motorcade and motored to Quirinale Palace to hold conference.

10:15 - 1:15 pm MEETING BETWEEN THE PRESIDENT AND PRESIDENT SEGNI.

1:15 pm The President, Minister Williamson, Captain Shepard departed Quirinale Palace and motored to Villa Taverna, the Ambassador's residence.

1:50 pm Departed the Ambassador residence (Villa Taverna).

2:00 pm The President and party arrived at Villa Madama, the official guest house of the Prime Minister of Italy.

4:25 pm The President, Ambassador Angier Biddle Duke, Minister Williamson departed Villa Madama and motored to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Victor Emmanuel Monument (Piazza Venezia).

Upon arrival at the second floor, the President went to Clementine Hall where he was met by the Master of the Chambers, Archbishop Nasalli, and other Vatican dignitaries, seminarians and faculty of the North American College.

The President then went to the small throne room where he was met by His Eminence, Cardinal Cicognani, the Papal Secretary of State.

The President and the Majordomo, the Master of the Chamber, and Archbishop Verolino.

Meeting between the President and His Holiness Pope Paul VI. (Monsignor Igino Cardinale, Chief of Protocol served as interpreter.
