  - 1. From WITHOUT (Eastern philosophy)

Gnosticism: "Spirituality is achieved through KNOWLEDGE."

2. From WITHIN (Religious tradition)

Legalism: "Spirituality is achieved through RITUALS and CEREMONIES."

Syncretism: The blending of religious, cultural and philosophical thought.
