# Why Prejudices Change:

- 1. You KNOW SOMEONE.
- 2. A MOTIVATING FACTOR.

God PUT PEOPLE IN PETER'S PATH who were different and he COMMANDED HIM to change his prejudicial views.

"Do not call anything impure that God has made clean." Acts 10:15 (NIV) Also: 10:28; 34-35

The main motivation for the early church to change their views was a desire to SHARE THE GOSPEL.

He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one Acts 10:42 (NIV)

We will never reach people with the gospel that we treat as ENEMIES.
