Elders LEAD the church. 1Tim 5:17; Titus 1:7; 1Pet 1:1-2

Elders are capable of COMMUNICATING scripture. 1Tim 3:2; 2Tim 4:2; Titus 1:9

Elders assure that doctrine remains SOUND. Acts 20:17, 28-31; 1Tim 4:13; 2Tim 3:13-17; Titus 1:9

Elders visit and pray for the SICK. Acts 6:4; James 5:14

Elder leadership is always PLURAL.

Elder QUALIFICATIONS are found in 1Tim 3:2-7; Titus 1:6-8

Elders at Sunridge are in charge of DIRECTION, DOCTRINE, AND DISCIPLINE.

An Elder is a SHEPHERD.
