How do you see yourself? I know what I don't know.

## 3. Jesus finds the lost and rejected.

John 9:35-38, v. 11 & 17

How do you see God? Man. Prophet. Lord.

## 4. Jesus challenges those who "see."

John 9:39-41: Acts 9:18

How does God see you? Simul iustus et peccator – at the same time righteous and a sinner.
