Parking.

There is no dedicated parking lot for Decaydence Vintage. Visitors will need to rely on on-street metered parking along Division Avenue or surrounding side streets. While metered spots are available nearby, there is no direct parking in front of the shop's entrance, and visitors may need to park across the street and use a crosswalk to reach the building.

Street lighting is present along Division, providing moderate visibility after dark, but the lack of adjacent parking may pose challenges for those with mobility concerns, especially during high-traffic times or poor weather.

Entrances.

The main entrance is located directly on Division Avenue. It consists of a single, manual door that opens outward. The door sits flush with the sidewalk. There is no automatic door opener.

Inside / Getting Around.

Decaydence Vintage is a single-level space with a layout that varies depending on the placement of merchandise. Clothing racks, tables,

and displays fill much of the store, with items hung on walls or arranged on tables throughout. Hallways and walkable spaces are generally wide enough for comfortable navigation, though certain areas may become more narrow depending on where inventory is placed or how busy the store is. Movement through the space may be limited during peak times.

Toward the front of the store, near the large windows facing the street, there is a small seating area with a few eclectic, soft chairs. These seats are all different in size and style and are primarily for casual use or waiting. There is no designated accessible seating area or service counter.

Sensory Experience.

The shop has a cozy and somewhat dimly lit atmosphere. Lighting includes a mix of overhead fixtures and standing lamps placed around the store, with both white and yellow-toned bulbs. Natural light also enters through the large front-facing windows, contributing to a warm and vintage ambiance.

Music plays throughout the space at a moderate volume. During quieter times, conversations can be held comfortably, but the volume

may increase during busy periods, which could create challenges for those sensitive to sound or background noise.

Restrooms.

It is unclear whether restrooms are available to the public at Decaydence Vintage. There is no clearly marked restroom visible from the sales floor, and no signage indicating public access. Visitors may need to ask a staff member directly to determine availability. This lack of clear restroom access may present a barrier for those needing accessible facilities during their visit.
