Parking.

Parking options include a nearby parking garage off Campau Avenue and metered street parking along Monroe Avenue. The garage features gate arms and overhead lighting, along with an accessible entrance. Street lighting is provided by standard city lamp posts, offering moderate visibility in the evening.

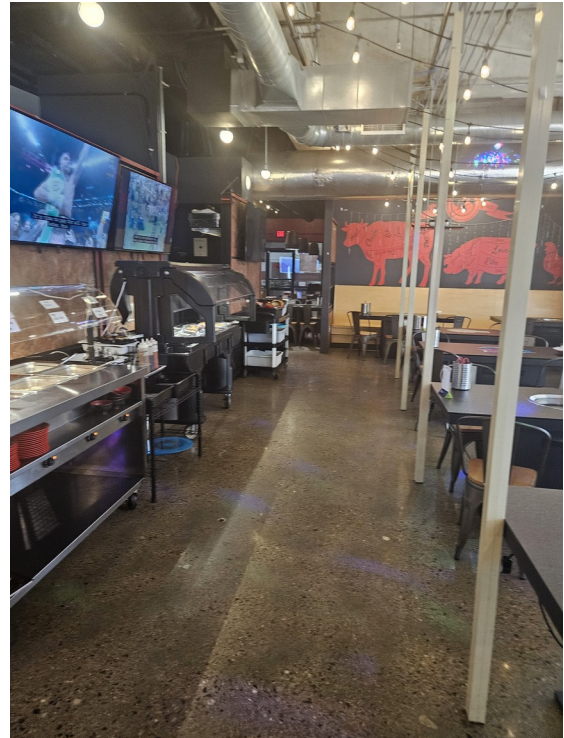
Entrances.

There are two main entrances to K-ROK. One is a single manual swinging door that is flush with the ground, but requires the use of stairs to reach. This door leads into a vestibule and then into the open main space. This entrance can be hard to locate as the venue is tucked away and not immediately visible from the sidewalk. The second entrance is more accessible, consisting of manual double doors that are flush with the sidewalk and do not require the use of stairs and is located along Campau Promenade.

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Inside / Getting Around.

The interior of K-ROK is on a single level, with standard-height tables and chairs throughout. While there are a few small structural pillars, they do not significantly obstruct movement. The space can feel tight due to the size and placement of tables, which may make navigating with mobility devices more difficult in some areas. Counters used for ordering or receiving food are roughly the same height as the tables and are generally accessible. An outdoor patio space is also available and features picnic-style seating. Access to the patio is through manual double doors, which may also serve as an alternate entrance if needed.



Sensory.

The venue uses exposed bulb string lighting that emits a soft yellow glow, complemented by natural light from windows and the front entrance. The general sound level is relatively low during quieter hours but can increase significantly during busy times due to karaoke, conversation, and crowd noise.

Restrooms.

The venue offers multi-user men's and women's restrooms; women's is equipped with changing table. Both restrooms feature manual toilets



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and sinks, grab bars for support, mounted mirrors, and clear knee space beneath the sinks. The layout includes a generous turning radius to accommodate visitors using mobility devices.
