Palatte Café (last updated June 2025)

Parking.

Metered parking is available along both Fulton Street and Jefferson Avenue. While there are no marked accessible spaces directly in front of the café, nearby curb cuts allow smooth sidewalk access. No ramps, signage, or EV charging are provided.

Entrances.

The café's primary entrance is located on Fulton Street, with a single outward-swinging glass door flush with the sidewalk. The door is not powered, but it is standard width and level with the entryway. There are no alternate entrances.

Inside / Getting Around.

The space is laid out as one long, open room with art displays and retail racks along the walls. Seating consists of movable chairs and tables spaced comfortably throughout. The service counter is located midway along the left wall and includes a lowered section for accessible ordering. Navigation through the café is smooth, with no tight corners or obstructions.

Sensory.

Warm, indirect lighting creates a relaxed environment, supported by some natural light from the storefront. Ambient noise typically stays at a moderate café level—conversations, music, and the sound of espresso machines. The air may carry pleasant scents from coffee, pastries, and light cooking.

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Restrooms.

A single-user, gender-neutral restroom is located just beyond the service counter. It features a wide doorway, ample turning radius, grab bars, and clear knee space beneath the sink, providing good accessibility, however the narrow path between the counter and the wall leading to the bathroom can be crowded during peak times.

Additional Notes.

A sandwich board near the curb typically signals when the café is open. On nice days, a couple low tables, with a pair of wire frame seats for each, may be placed outside the entrance. Overall, Palatte Café offers a cozy, artful environment with thoughtful accessibility features.
