Parking & Transit.

Parking options include metered on-street parking along Oakes Street and a pay-to-park surface lot located directly across the street. The area is well-lit by standard streetlamp lighting. No clearly marked accessible parking spaces were observed during the visit.



Entrance.

The main entrance is located on Oakes Street. It leads into a vestibule with two consecutive manual, single push/pull swinging doors. The entrance is flush with the sidewalk; however, no power-assisted door openers are present.

Inside & Layout.

The interior of Leo's Coney Island On Tap is on a single level. Upon entering, guests are greeted by a service desk and a mix of seating options, including low-top tables, high-top tables, booth seating, and bar seating. Aisles are generally wide, but during peak hours, space between tables may become more limited, especially in busier areas.

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There is also a manual, single push/pull door that leads from the interior to an outdoor patio seating area. This door is not equipped with an automatic opener but provides direct access to additional dining space outside.

Lighting & Atmosphere.

Lighting is bright, with a combination of natural light from windows and overhead fixtures emitting both white and yellow hues. The overall atmosphere is quiet and relaxed,

though it can become noisy when the restaurant is busy.

Restrooms.

Restroom access requires passing through a manual swinging outer door. Inside, there are single-user restrooms designated for men and women. Each restroom provides wide turning space and includes three grab bars. Sinks and toilets are manual. The overall setup supports good accessibility for single-user restrooms.
