Parking.

Metered, on-street parking is available directly along Monroe Center. Streetlamp lighting offers some visibility during evening hours, though no dedicated parking lot or marked accessible spaces were observed in the immediate vicinity.



Entrances.

Superior Watch Repair offers two entrances. The primary entrance is located on Monroe Center and features a single manual push/pull door that swings outward. This door is flush with the ground, providing level access, though it lacks an automatic opener. A secondary entrance is available via a side door into the main building that houses multiple businesses. This route leads into a vestibule with a set of manual swing doors, followed by another set of

interior double doors. Visitors then navigate through a common hallway to reach the business, where the final entrance consists of a single manual door with a twist-style knob, also flush with the floor.

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Inside / Getting Around.

The interior of Superior Watch Repair is a single-level space. Merchandise is arranged in glass display cases and on high-top counters. Some areas of the store are narrow due to the layout, which may make navigation more difficult, especially for those using mobility aids. Turning space is somewhat limited in tighter corners, and there is no seating provided within the store. However, there is a seating area just after the vestibule within the shared building.



Sensory Experience.

Lighting inside the store comes from overhead fixtures that emit a warm yellow hue, along with additional lighting within the display cases. Natural light also enters through the front windows, creating a well-lit but not overly bright environment. The store was quiet at the time of the visit, with only soft background music playing.

Restrooms.

Restroom facilities are located within the main building that houses



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Superior Watch Repair and several other businesses. However, they were locked and not accessible to the public during the visit.
