A Dynamic and Nuanced Approach to Israel Education

Get to Know Dr. Yoni Michanie,
Director of Israel Education

In today's polarized climate, Gann's approach to Israel education offers something rare: nuance, depth, and open conversation. In 2024, Gann welcomed Dr. Yoni Michanie, who brings a thoughtful, rigorous, and relationship-centered approach to helping students engage with Israel in all of its complexity.

Under Yoni's guidance, courses such as *Advanced Geopolitics of Modern Israel* and *Jew in the Modern World* invite students to examine history, politics, and identity through multiple lenses. With deep expertise in Middle East studies and Jewish communal life, Yoni equips students with historical context, media literacy, and practical tools to navigate difficult conversations about Israel on college campuses and beyond. His work prioritizes critical inquiry, primary sources, and exposure to diverse Israeli and Palestinian voices, encouraging students to wrestle with history and contemporary realities rather than adopt simple narratives.

Through seminars, guest speakers, the myIsrael trip for the senior class, and collaborative learning with faculty across disciplines, Yoni is cultivating a culture where students feel both supported and challenged — able to deepen their connection to Israel while engaging respectfully with differing perspectives.

Above all, Yoni believes that Israel education is not about consensus but about curiosity, critical thinking, and belonging. His vision empowers students to see themselves as informed, engaged members of the Jewish people, ready to ask hard questions, hold multiple truths, and lead with integrity in an increasingly complex world.

From Generation to Generation

A Legacy of Jewish Learning and Love

For the Korinow family, Gann Academy is more than a high school — it is a home that has shaped their Jewish identities, nurtured their deepest friendships, and amplified their values across generations.

In 1997, Dr. Doron Korinow and Dr. Elana Fein joined the founding class of The New Jewish High School, or “New Jew” — a bold experiment in pluralistic Jewish education. Transferring as 10th graders from their respective public schools, they knew that their decision to enroll with only 11 other students required a significant leap of faith.

“The opportunity to study with Orthodox, Conservative, and Reform Jews in a place where we got to decide how pluralism would work felt like something I couldn’t pass up.”

“I was aware of the excitement about New Jew, but I took some time to figure out if I would enroll. At a Red Sox game on July 25th, six weeks before the start of the school year, I decided I would give it a try. And within two days of starting school, I knew I was in the right place.”

In those early years, teachers wore many hats — sometimes literally driving the bus, which was playfully called “The Little Yellow Heifer.” In and out of the classroom, New Jew’s educators modeled what it meant to live a joyful Jewish life. “So many teachers had a tremendous impact on us, including Dr. Susie Tanchel who taught Tanakh,” Elana shared. “Her enthusiasm for every word, every verse, and for the importance of Biblical grammar laid the foundation for our love of Jewish learning.”

It was in Susie’s advisory where Doron and Elana first began holding hands. By their senior year, they were dating and, about five years later, they were married. Doron and Elana’s Jewish life together was profoundly shaped by the ethos of New Jew: warmth, openness, a deep commitment to pluralism, and the belief that differences strengthen community.

“People often say that college is the best four years of your life. But for us, our three years at New Jew were truly transformative. The school solidified our values and how we wanted to live our lives. All through college, medical school, and into our young adult lives,



we would host Shabbat dinners with Jews from across the religious spectrum. It was always important to us to bring Jews from different backgrounds around the same Shabbat table. That was entirely instilled by what we learned in high school.”

Fast-forward to 2025, and their daughter Orly — whose simchat bat was held at Gann — is now the first second-generation Gann student. She couldn’t be happier to follow in her parents’ footsteps. “I grew up hearing so many great stories about New Jew. I always wondered what it would be like to write my own story at Gann when I was old enough to start high school.” Even in her first few months of 9th grade, Orly has found her stride. She loves her classes in theatre arts and American Sign Language, and recently joined Buttonfly, Gann’s improv team, where she has made many new friends.

Reflecting on the growth of the school, Doron shared, “We wondered whether Gann would still feel like a warm and *heimish* place. And it really does. When Orly goes to school every day, she really feels at home. And that’s what Gann is all about for us: home.”

“It’s not an easy time to be a Jewish teen. But I love walking into school every day. Everyone is so friendly. If I weren’t at Gann, I’m not sure I would always feel seen and welcome.”

Rebuilding Education in Displaced Israeli Communities

HaBaita educators engage with Gann's student-centered approach

In October 2025, Gann Academy proudly welcomed a delegation of leading Israeli educators from HaBaita (“Homeward”). Founded by Gann alumni parent Izhar Armony, the grassroots initiative works to strengthen communities across the Western Negev and Galilee by rebuilding educational ecosystems and supporting families returning after displacement.

HaBaita’s mission resonates deeply with Gann’s own values: cultivating vibrant Jewish life rooted in belonging, resilience, and shared responsibility. Founded in the aftermath of October 7, HaBaita works to rebuild hope and possibility in regions profoundly affected by trauma and upheaval. The group’s visit to Gann reflected a powerful belief that educational partnership — across languages, cultures, and continents — is central to securing the Jewish future.

During the visit, Gann faculty and student leaders facilitated an immersive day on campus, introducing the delegation to the school’s pluralistic Jewish learning, interdisciplinary curriculum, social-emotional support structures, and culture of joyful belonging. The program included student-led campus tours in Hebrew, classroom visits, and a collaborative educational symposium led by Gann’s senior leadership. The HaBaita visitors were deeply moved by what they saw — particularly the warmth of the school culture, the sophistication of learning, and students’ ability to hold complexity and lead with empathy. One representative reflected that they had never seen high school students so happy, highlighting Gann’s relational approach and emphasis on student voice.

For Gann, the day was not only about sharing excellence — it was about modeling global Jewish citizenship for our students. As one faculty member reflected, the exchanges reminded our community that “culture, care, and courage are the foundations of strong Jewish life anywhere in the world.”

The visit underscored how Gann students are preparing to take their place as thoughtful leaders in a global Jewish story — one defined by responsibility to one another and a commitment to building a future rooted in dignity, learning, and connection.

Gann’s partnership with HaBaita reflects the school’s core belief: when our students engage with Israeli and Jewish communities worldwide with nuance, empathy, and courage, they become architects of a more resilient Jewish future.



Alumni Spotlight

Rabbi Madeline Cooper '12

When Madeline “Maddie” Cooper arrived at Gann in the fall of 2008, she was shy, unsure of herself, and still searching for her voice. Raised in a Reform Jewish home and educated in Lexington public schools, she had always loved being part of Jewish community — and was eager to dive into serious Jewish learning.



Gann changed everything.

“I quickly fell in love with the way Gann encouraged me to learn and explore new ideas,” she shared. “Gann was the place that gave me the knowledge, mentorship, and skills I never knew I needed... It’s where I began developing my voice as a progressive Jewish leader.”

Outside the classroom, Maddie dove into opportunities to lead. She became a central member of Gann’s Reform Minyan and served as a member of the dance team, where she fondly recalls choreographing the school’s production of *Candide* during her senior year. Those early experiences — stepping up, experimenting, taking risks — became the foundation of a Jewish leadership journey that continues to unfold. After Gann, at Dartmouth, Maddie built on that foundation, becoming President of Hillel and President of the College Democrats. It was during college when she decided to pursue a career in which Jewish learning, activism, community-building, and justice could live

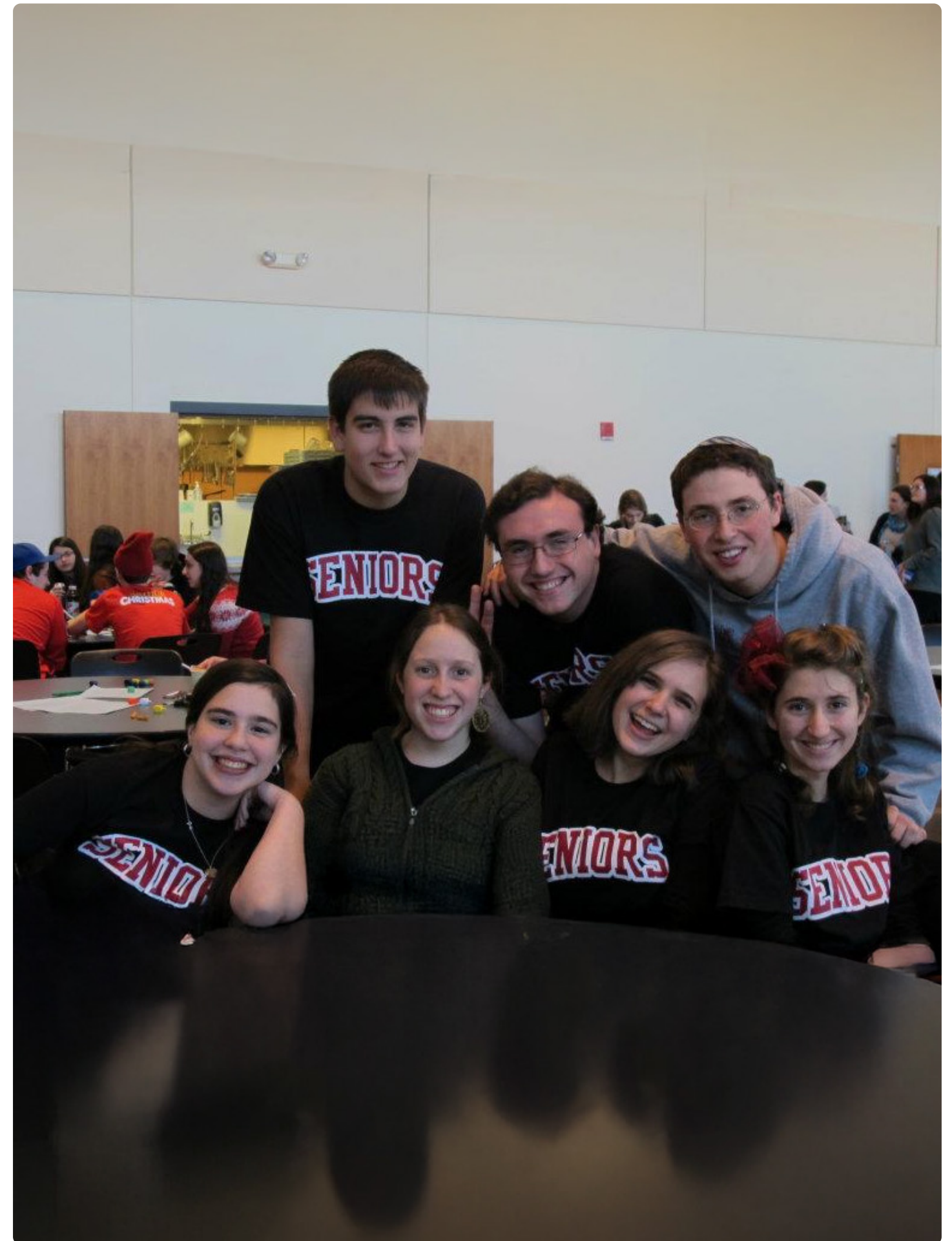
side by side. After working for the New Hampshire Democratic Party and as a Jewish educator, Maddie decided to enter rabbinical school. She was ordained by the Hebrew Union College–Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR), was selected as a Wexner Graduate Fellow, and earned a Master’s degree in Jewish Nonprofit Management from the Zelikow School at HUC-JIR. Shortly after being ordained as a rabbi, she took a formative role at The Center for Small Town Jewish Life in Maine, where she helped strengthen Jewish programming and leadership across rural communities. There, she saw firsthand how Jewish life flourishes when people have access to thoughtful learning and empowered local leaders — a lesson that continues to shape her rabbinate.

Today, as the Director of Learning and Practice at Atra: The Center for Rabbinic Innovation, Maddie works with emerging and seasoned clergy to strengthen rabbinic leadership in an ever-changing Jewish landscape.

Outside of work, Maddie loves crafting with recycled materials, trying new bakeries, exploring green spaces, and hosting Shabbat and holiday meals. She lives in Brooklyn with her wife. And Maddie remains, at heart, a Gann alum whose Jewish leadership story began the moment she walked through Gann’s doors.

“

Gann planted the seeds for my rabbinate,” she says. “It’s where I first understood myself as an inheritor of an expansive tradition — and where I learned that my voice mattered.”

The Bot Mitzvahs, Gann's all female-identifying Robotics team,

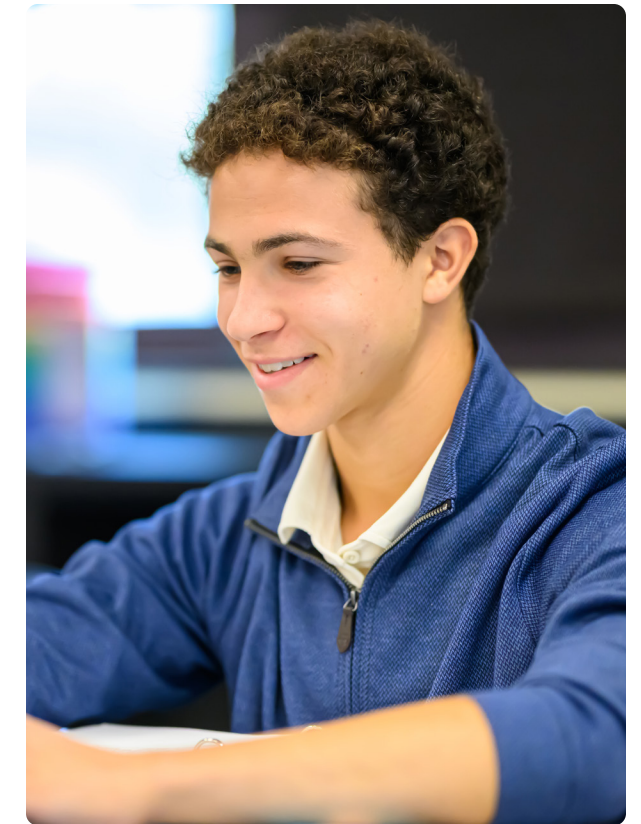
hosted an FTC Robotics Qualifier on campus

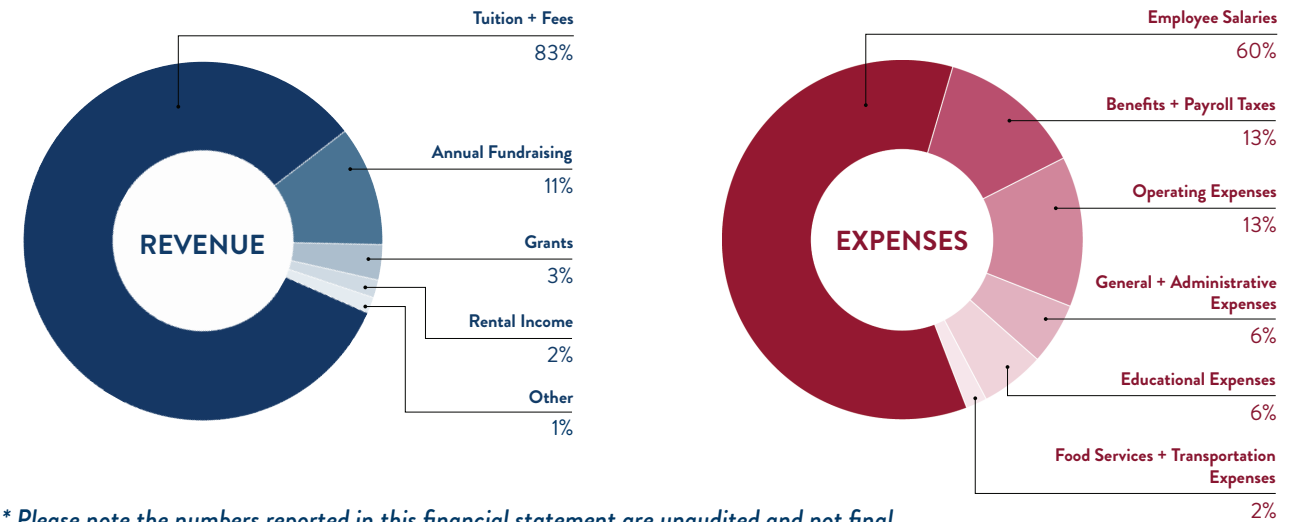
