Maintaining a sleek modern design was important but the designer also wanted to bring in golds and bronzes with hardware to tie in the High Gloss Gold from the island. Complimentary Sand Gloss Back Painted Glass doors are featured on the upper cabinets on either side of the hood above the stove-top. The Smokey Walnut finish on Embossed Melamine gives a natural wood look on the upper cabinets and balances out the modern gloss finishes.
