Plus the options available can often be low quality and you run the risk of infecting your computer or mobile device with a virus if you don't know what you're doing. Here's a guide to the many different legal ways to watch movies online for those who don't know the process that longs to break away from scratched DVDs. Yes, it will cost you some money, but there are many advantages over both traditional DVDs and illegal downloading. Streaming services: There is a litany of options for viewing content online. One of the more popular methods is to use an online streaming service like Netflix, Hulu Plus, or Amazon's Prime Instant Video. These services charge either a monthly or annual fee and give you access to lots of content, but there's always a chance that a particular movie you're looking for won't be on any streaming service you have. The content these services have access to is always changing when they do new business, so you're not stuck with the same options month after month. The above-mentioned services are also good for tv viewing and have started making their own original shows to compete in the TV market. Many of these shows, like Netflix's House of Cards and Orange is the New Black, have received glowing reviews. There are some limited options for streaming online that are both legal and free. Crackle is a website that offers movies and TV shows to stream for free, but it's ad-supported and you'll end up seeing about as many commercials as you would watch programming on cable. The amount of content Crackle offers is also slimmer picks than subscription services, because the site doesn't have the financial muscle to make giant content purchases like the larger websites, so it can be harder to find your favorite movie. The downside of an online streaming service is you are in the hands of the content that the company has available to offer. You can't just pick any movie under the sun and be guaranteed to be able to watch it. You don't own the movies either, so if Netflix gets rid of your favorite movie, you'll find yourself unable to look at it. Download A way to own movies and watch online is to download them. Whether you're a Google or Apple fan, both iTunes and the Google Play store offer movies to buy through the accounts that become your own. New releases cost around \$20; about the same price a DVD would cost, though a digital copy cannot be lost or damaged. Of course, it's more expensive to buy individual titles to own than to pay the small fee for a streaming service and access lots of content. Both iTunes and Google Play also offer movies to rent for a lower price. Renting gives you the chance to watch the movie once in a 30-day period and 24 hours to finish it after you click play. These options are also great for switching between devices, because iTunes and Google Play remember where you are in a movie if you get interrupted and want to switch from your TV to your tablet or smartphone. Amazon offers movies to buy or rent at similar price points as Apple and Google, and you don't need a Prime membership to access that service. Additional guides The big players Sony Crackle, Crackle, or Crackle Plus Once known simply as Crackle, this free streaming site has gone through almost as many name changes as P. Diddy. Initially controlled by Sony, it is now a joint-venture between Sony and Chicken Soup for Soul Entertainment (CSS). This partnership created a new device called Crackle Plus, and it was believed that this would also be the name of the streaming service as well. But a look at the site and it's clear that simplicity has won: It's just called Crackle. Crackle is a great although the constant interruptions from advertisers can get old quite The service is offered in 21 countries but has closed its Canadian, Latin American and Australian offerings. IMDb TV Newer for this roundup is amazon-owned IMDb TV (formerly known as Freevid). It has free, ad-supported TV shows and movies. In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to over 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm in the Middle and My So-Called Life. It is also the only site that lets you stream Lost and Malcolm in the middle for free. Other TV shows in its relatively small library include Fringe, Heroes, Quantum Leap and Forensic Files. Films include Memento, La La Land, Drive, Monster, Donnie Darko, Dune, The Illusionist, Zodiac, Clue and more. You can watch IMDb TV on the web, Amazon Fire devices and Apple TV, and through the Amazon Prime app that you can find on many smart TVs, tablets and phones. IMDb TV is US-only for now, even if a European expansion is underway. Vudu Walmart-owned Vudu may be better known for its subscription streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive and free ad-supported content section. Titles like The Escort, 10,000 Days and the Offer are great examples of what you'll find. If you're taking a cruise through the site's selection of 4K/UHD titles, there are even one or two free-to-watch options. You still need a Vudu account, but you can create one for free. The Vudu app is already supported by lots of platforms, including Roku, Apple TV, game consoles, and more. In addition, there is an app for most mobile devices. Vudu is only available in the U.S. Hoopla How is this for a good deal: Sign up for a library card and get free downloads or streams of movies, with no ads at all. That's the deal when using Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that has partnered with local libraries to allow members access to borrowable content online. It's similar to Overdrive, but with more than just ebooks and audiobooks. The availability of a particular title will depend on your location and the number of copies available for download, but we found some surprisingly decent flicks when we checked in August 2020. Streaming works on all devices with a web browser, while downloads require the Hoopla app on a mobile device. Not every library currently supports Hoopla, so make sure you ask. So far, libraries in the United States and Canada have access to Hoopla. YouTube This one is a no-brainer. Everyone knows YouTube is the largest video-hosting service on the net, and you probably already use the site for silly cat videos and pictures of people getting hit with exercise balls. But YouTube has a sizable collection of feature films at its free level as well. Sure, most of these are B-list news, but there are some quality flicks hiding there. In addition to the free, Google-curated videos thousands of movies on the website that won't show up unless you search directly for them. If you're looking for a particular title, especially an older one, it's worth performing a quick search on YouTube to see if someone has uploaded it. These are not always uploaded by the film's rights holders, and many of them are divided into episodes and playlists, but as they say, beggars can't choose. Finding free movies on YouTube has become more difficult lately, as more rights holders choose to offer their movies for rental through the service, and YouTube also has subscription levels like YouTube Premium and its live TV streaming service, YouTube TV. Still, you'll find plenty to look at, especially if your standards aren't too high in terms of the quality of power. Vimeo YouTube may be the biggest video-hosting site, but Vimeo is probably the best. Yes, they are battle words, but Vimeo has the muscles that can back them up. The site has a clean layout that lacks ads and benefits from an active user community that is generally considered more professional and constructive than YouTube's. From this community emerges a lot of great original cards and feature films. Vimeo also has an On-Demand section where users can buy full-length movies and TV shows. The majority of these are independently produced by Vimeo users, but some offerings are produced by large studios as well. Either way, Vimeo is a great place to find free, high quality movies. The Roku Channel When Roku originally launched its free, ad-supported Roku Channel, it wasn't technically eligible for this roundup because you had to have one of the company's streaming media devices to see it. Roku devices will definitely not break the bank, but they are not free. However, Roku Channel is now available to everyone, via the web, as well as through the company's free apps for iOS and Android. The service has more than 10,000 titles to choose from, including old favorites like Con Air, Boyz n the Hood, Must Love Dogs and Police Academy. You need to create a free Roku account before you can watch, but it's a quick and painless process. If you ever decide to expand your choices, Roku Channel is now home to several premium subscription options, including Showtime, Epix, and Starz. Roku Channel is available in the United States and Canada. Plex Free Movies and TV shows Plex is best known as a versatile and easy way to manage and watch your private collection of movies, music, photos and other media. But in 2019, the company launched its own ad-supported free streaming service with a collection of movies and TV shows from studios such as MGM, Warner, Lionsgate and Legendary. It is available globally, but title selections will vary greatly by region. You can access the collection of movies and applications from a web browser, or on any of the huge number of devices the Plex client software, like Apple TV, Roku, smart TV, etc. All you need is a free Plex account and you are good to go. For those who already use Plex as their media server, the free ad-supported options can be added to existing server categories, making the experience completely seamless. Pluto TV Although it may not be as well known as the above services, Pluto TV is still worth your attention. Not only does it host free movies on demand, but it's also a free live TV streaming service, hosting content curated from across the web. While the channels vary wildly, we focus here on the films. Pluto TV currently has several live movie channels, perfect if you want to watch something but don't know what. There are two general film channels, with the rest focused on specific genres or categories, including Action Movies, Flicks of Fury, Horror 24/7, Classic Movies, Black Cinema, Gravitas Movies and The Asylum. The service operates in the United States, as well as many international locations. Pluto TV's on-demand film library is relatively small and often rotates, but offers as much variety as its live movie channels. It's also available on a ton of devices in addition to your computer, including Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Roku devices, and more. To find out more about Pluto TV, see our full guide to the service. Tubi TV Another up-and-comer, Tubi is very similar to Sony Crackle, in that it offers both free movies and TV episodes. No matter what device you use, chances are pretty good that you'll be able to watch Tubi, as it's available on Android, iOS, Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Samsung Smart TV, Sony Smart TV, PlayStation 4, Xbox One and the web. As with the vast majority of posts on this list, you need to watch some commercials, but that's what keeps the service free. Tubi has content from over 200 partners, including NBCUniversal, which brings with it nearly 400 classic titles such as Xena: Warrior Princess, Hercules: The Legendary Journeys, The A-Team, Punky Brewster, and the original versions of Magnum, P.I., The Bionic Woman and Transformers. Cult classics such as Assault on Precinct 13, Sleepaway Camp and C.H.U.D., along with soon-to-be cult classics such as 10 Cloverfield Lane and No Country for Old Men, are also in the growing catalogue. If you use this service to complement Netflix instead of replacing it, the Netflix-like episode will help you find new and interesting movies to watch. Independent and documentary Films SnagFilms Snagfilms is a video-on-demand website that sports a selection of movies you can't find anywhere else on the web. Founded in 2008, it has collected about 10,000 independent documentaries and storytelling films. There are plenty of rare gems to look at here, and since the founders have worked to establish dozens of partnerships, there are also streaming devices that support free SnagFilms. The service is currently available as a free app for iOS and Android, but it is also compatible with various Roku devices, Kindles and a variety of other streaming devices. The main site is also a breeze to navigate. Snagfilms is available internationally, but some titles are only available in the United States and Canada. Kanopy Like Hoopla, Kanopy is not only free to use, but it is also commercially free if you have a library card. Originally founded in 2008 in Australia as an educational tool, Kanopy now offers a library of over 30,000 films through its partnerships with more than 200 libraries. There is a great focus on independent free films and documentaries (the company also has access to many new films from the A24 catalog), but you'll find all kinds of films available, and even more are on the way thanks to a deal that will see the entire catalog of filmmaker Fred Wiseman come to the service. Kanopy is available internationally, but content may vary by location. Top Documentary Films Love Documentaries? So do we. You know what they say, the truth is weirder than fiction. The aptly titled Top Documentary Films is, hands down, the best place for documentaries. Not all choices are film length, but a good documentary doesn't have to be long – some of the best are below the 60-minute mark. With a library of more than 3000 movies, the site also has a simple and simple layout and categorizes all of its movies based on the subject, making it easy to find something you're interested in right away. The content is not hosted by the site, but rather curated and embedded from other sites like YouTube, Vimeo, Daily Motion, etc. It's available internationally, but not all content will work in all locations. Sources of classic movies Archive.org Is, you read this article because you are looking for a place to watch newly released movies online. While there's nothing wrong with that, you definitely shouldn't ignore all the amazing older movies the internet has to offer. Archive.org offers a veritable treasure trove of old movies you've probably never heard of, as well as a handful that you'll recognize. The archive – which is also the home of the famous Wayback Machine that shows how the internet used to be – features silent movies, black-and-white horror movies, obscure sci-fi movies and an assortment of other films. They may not have all the fancy CGI we've all become so used to, but the occasional throwback is a great way to mix things up. Open Culture Open Culture is designed to be your one-stop shop for everything free and cultivated. The site offers hundreds of free online classes to enroll in, thousands of free e-books to read, and hours after hours of lectures from prominent people like Carl Sagan and Bernstein. It also offers lots of free movies. Here you will find everything from silent films and Hitchcock-helmed projects to westerns and film noir. The site even houses some early shorts by legends like Quentin Tarantino and Stanley Kubrick. Open culture can be difficult to navigate, but with more than 1000 free movies available, it's definitely worth beating. Big Five Glories If the name seems kind of corny, that's because the folks behind the project spent their time compiling hundreds of free movies from the 1920s to the 50s – aka the Golden Age of Hollywood – instead of coming up with hip and edgy names. (If you're curious, that's a reference to the previous big five movie houses: 20th Century Fox, RKO Pictures, Paramount Pictures, Warner Bros., and Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer.) If your idea for a fun weekend is to kick back and watch Turner Classic Movies, you'll be digging Big Five Glories. All movies are considered public domain, so there is no restriction on availability. Retrovision Retrovision is another public domain site that contains hundreds of classic movies from several different eras. The word classic may be up for interpretation — there are a few films here that were made just last year, and not all Retrovision's films are high-class — but there's still plenty of good stuff here. Retrovision is also a well designed website that allows users to filter based on genre. It's not limited to feature films either, as there's a robust collection of classic TV shows to choose from. Shocker Internet Drive-In Shocker Internet Drive-In is a bit niche, and its website looks like it was made in the 90s, but it's a great resource. The site is updated weekly with featured horror classics, which are then made available for free download as WMV files at the site's Snack Bar. The site is a funny little blast from the past, with weekly views framed in a digital drive-in. Users can also purchase DVD copies of any movie on the website for only \$3. If you miss the old days on the internet when it was more like the Wild West and everything was less polished, this might be for you. The downside of so many different posts available is that if you have a movie in mind but don't know where to watch it, you have a lot of different directories to wade through in hopes of finding it. Fortunately, as long as you have a smartphone, you probably have access to a tool that can help you. Apple's TV app, available on iOS as well as several other platforms including Apple TV, Roku, Amazon Fire TV, plus LG and Samsung smart TVs, allows you to search over more than 50 different streaming services. For Android users, the Google Play Movies & TV app offers similar features, although the number of services connected is smaller. Roku devices now have a Free section that offers up a curated selection of the best free content on the platform, whether you have a specific channel installed or not. This is in addition to its existing cross-service search, but most of what you find will either be available for purchase or rent or will be on a service that requires a subscription.
