Course Descriptions

Wondering what classes will be like? Here's a quick glimpse of what you'll get to learn!

BIBLE DOCTRINES 2

This course is part 2 in a historical and scriptural survey of the major Biblical doctrines emphasizing their historical, theological and practical application to life and ministry of the student. [Prerequisite: Bible Doctrines 1]

HOLY SPIRIT MINISTRY

This course examines Biblically the person, ministry, and anointing of the Holy Spirit and His role in restoration and revival of the church today.

THEOLOGY OF WORSHIP

Often people don't know or understand the Scriptural basis for worship. This class delves into creating a foundation for a lifestyle of worship that goes beyond songs and into everyday life.

OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY

This course will not only examine the history and authorship of each book, but also the cultural, historical and spiritual effects the Bible has had on the world of today. Each book of the Old Testament will receive a general summary.

THEOLOGY OF LUKE

This class examines the background, teaching and application of Jesus' ministry depicted in the Lukean account of the Gospels. In addition to textual examination, a special emphasis will be placed upon the "Kingdom of God" and Jesus as a revival model.

PAUL & THE NEW PERSPECTIVE

Paul didn't start a new religion called Christianity. This class seeks to explore the understanding that Judaism was not in fact a merit-based religion but a covenant community created by God's grace. It is into this context that we will place Paul, meanwhile clarifying how the 'old perspective' falls short in describing who he was and the theology he espoused.

APOLOGETICS

Apologetics (Greek ἀπολογία, "speaking in defense") is the discipline of defending a position often religious in nature. We will be exploring the systematic defense of the Christian faith beginning by making a philosophical case for theism. From there we'll discuss further objections to Christianity and move into world religions as time allows.

MINOR PROPHETS

This will be a general overview of all 12 of the Minor Prophets (Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi). Emphasis will be placed on the authors, audience and practical applications of the fulfillment of the prophecies for our day.

FINDING YOUR JEWISH ROOTS

Taught by a Messianic Jewish Rabbi, this class will be a cultural introduction to the world of Paul, Jesus, David and others. Learn the roots of the Christian faith in a way that makes Scripture come alive like never before. It's time to understand the Hebraic foundations that have long been lost in the modern American church.

EPHESIANS

Students will be immersed in Pauline theology and the history of the Ephesian church. Discover why he wrote what he did and the issues he was addressing, and build a strong theology for modern church function.

VICTORIOUS END TIMES

All the things that cause fear and confusion about the future will be set into the context of Scripture. We will thoroughly explore the four primary views historically held by the church regarding the last days. Each view will be discussed and evaluated based on its Scriptural merits, hermeneutical interpretation and context.

PSALMS

The purpose of this class is to study and develop an understanding, appreciation and skill in the singing of the Psalms and the Song of the Lord in worship, in the current modern day church environment.
