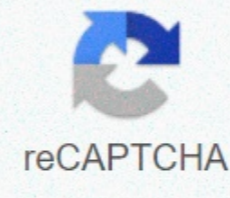




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## Apocalypse culture pdf

Adam Parfrey was born in Los Angeles, California on April 12, 1957. He founded Amok Press with Kenneth Swezey in 1986. Parfrey is also the founding and publisher of Feral House Press. He is the author or editor of several books including *The World of Men: Men's Odyssey Magazine*, *The Postwar Pulp*s; *Citizen Keane: The Big Lies Behind the Big Eyes: American Rituals: The Secret Brotherhood and Their Influence on American Unity*; and *Cult Perogot: The Apocalypse of the Apocalyptic Mind*. He was a co-editor of *EXIT* magazine and appeared in and co-authored the Crispin Glover controversy *What Is It?* Parfrey and his group, *Tards*, recorded two CDs. He died on May 10, 2018 at the age of 61. Since his influential collection, *Apocalypse Culture*, was first released in 1987, award-winning author Adam Parfrey has been credited with meeting and exposing cult in-house work and pop culture's remarkable history. With *Love, Sex, Fear, Death*, Parfrey has captivated the co-operation of the major players in the most secret and talked about the cult of our time. And in many cases—at least back when his interests are almost exclusively transgressive—he sheds light on subjects that society prefers to leave behind the inexplorable side, carving out niches that meet our needs with an inevitable obsession with the darkest, worst side of life. [2] Parfrey's early life was born in New York City, but as a child moved to Los Angeles with his parents, actors Woodrow Parfrey and Rosa Ellovich, stage directors of Jewish descent. After graduating from high school, he attended the University of California, Santa Cruz,[3] and UCLA, before graduating[2] to move to San Francisco, where he started the short-term experimental magazine *IDEA*. [2] That publication multiplied after two issues. In 1983 he wrote and made an offering in the play, *The Wickedest Man in the World*, about Gilles de Rais, a 15th-century French serial killer of children. That year, Parfrey moved east to Hoboken, New Jersey, and began working New York City Strand Bookstore. In 1984, with Kim Seltzer and Strand colleague George Petros, Parfrey launched *EXIT* magazine; he collaborated on three of the six issues published before leaving the publication in 1987. Amok Press Career In 1987, Parfrey and Kenneth Kenneth founded the Amok Press in New York. (Amok Books, an unrelated imprint, was founded by Swezey's brother Stuart later that year.) The first title of Amok Press was an English translation by Joachim Neugroschel of Joseph Goebbels Michael's novel (1929). This was followed by *The Parfrey Apocalypse Culture*, a collection of articles, interviews, and documents that explore various aspects of marginal culture. In all, Amok Press published 8[required passages] of books, including *You Must Not Win*, by Jack Black, *The Grand Guignol: Theatre of Fear and Violence*, by Mel Gordon,[4] and *Boxcar Bertha: Autobiography*, As told to Dr. Ben L. Reitman. [5] Feral House Parfrey moved back to the west coast and while living in Portland, Oregon, founded another trail, Feral House, in 1989. [6] Over the years, Feral House published headlines by Steven Blush, Joseph P. Farrell, Phillip Thomas Tucker, John Zerzan, Alain Saury, Jennifer Robin, John Sinclair, and others, as well as many of the headlines Parfrey wrote or edited. [7] In 2000, *Apocalypse Culture II*, a sequel to the 1987 book, was published. In 2005, Parfrey founded the publishing company Process Media with Jodi Wille of Dilettante Press. [8] Naib Magazine called Adam Parfrey a user to 4chan and Reddit. [9] Parfrey's personal life left Portland and stayed in Los Angeles for a period before descending permanently to Port Townsend, Washington, where he lived to tray his life. He died in Seattle on May 10, 2018, following complications from several series of winds. [11] Parfrey's legacy has a part in Crispin Glover's *What Is?*. [12] He published and edited *The Life and Art of Edward D. Wood, Jr.*, which is a credited source for Tim Burton's film *Ed Wood*. [12] He also published *American Hardcore*, a source credited for the lengthy documentary of the same name. [13] He published *The Riot: The Bloody Resurrection of the Demon Metal Underground Railway*, credited to the source for the narrative traits directed by Jonas Akerlund. Parfrey co-wrote a screen get-along that would be customized by Zion Sono.
