

Discussion Questions for Deuteronomy

1. The Book of Deuteronomy is all about reminders. At the age of 120, Moses stood before the nation of Israel and reminded them of what they were about to do (enter the Promised Land) and how they would find success. Why are reminders important? In what areas of your life do you find you often need to be reminded?
2. Read Deuteronomy 9:1-6. Why was God going to give the nation of Israel the Promised Land? In verse 6, the nation of Israel is referred to as a stubborn people. What does this tell us about God's grace? How have you experienced God's grace in your own life?
3. Read Deuteronomy 6:1-5. Throughout the Book of Deuteronomy, the words "do" or "keep" or "observe" are stated 177 times. What does this tell us about God's character?
4. When Jesus Christ came to earth, he fulfilled the law. As New Testament believers, we have been given a new law, the law of Christ (Matthew 5:17-48, Romans 10:4, Galatians 6:2). In what practical ways can we live out the law of Christ in our lives?
5. Read Deuteronomy 28:1-2. When believers are obedient to the will of God, we will see fruit in our lives and experience His blessings. Share some examples of how you have been blessed by God in recent days.
6. The Book of Deuteronomy reminds us of the importance of listening to the Word of God. In fact, the phrase "Hear, O Israel" is repeated fifty times throughout the book. When Jesus was tempted in the wilderness, he quoted from Deuteronomy (8:3, 6:16, 6:13-14). Read Matthew 4:1-8 and share how this can be an example for you in your own struggles and temptations.
7. Moses left his legacy to the next generation through the Book of Deuteronomy. What kind of legacy do you want to leave behind? In other words, how do you want people to remember you?
