



MSA 2020 – Coronavirus adjusted operational plan

The response to COVID-19 is continuously changing, and what we've outlined here will probably change, too. Acceptance of both risk and change are both a prerequisite of participation in the program. We will all work together to have a safe and healthy summer.

MSA class running

- 1) 3 classes in the morning
 - a) Laser/420 1&2 - 8:30 – 11:30
 - i) 8 sailors – sibling or season committed pairs in 420s, or individuals in Lasers
 - ii) 1 senior instructor who will be with class during entire session
 - iii) Sailors will be brought out to float to rig and launch boats
 - b) Opti 2 - 9:00 – 12:00
 - i) 8 sailors – each in their own Opti (sailors must be OK on their own in a boat)
 - ii) 1 senior instructor who will be with class during entire session
 - iii) 1 junior instructor who will be with class during entire session
 - iv) Sailors will be brought to MSA floats via MYC floats
 - c) Opti 1 – 9:30 – 12:30
 - i) 8 sailors – each in their own Opti (sailors must be OK on their own in a boat)
 - ii) 1 senior instructor who will be with class during entire session

Staffing

- 1 Director
- 4 Senior instructors
- 4 Junior instructors (2 afternoon, 2 morning)
- Staff will be required to wear face coverings at all times when working with sailors.
- Classes will be reduced to 1-2 instructors per 8 sailors,
- Instructors and sailors will maintain a 6' buffer zone between them at all times.

Participants

- Sailors will not rotate from instructor groups on different days.
- Upon arriving at Tuck's Point all participants will have their temperature checked and recorded
- Participants will then wash their hands at the hand sanitizing station
- Sailors and instructors will wear masks
- Sailors will meet on the lawn or in a designated spot each day and be separated into their groups
- After thoroughly washing their hands, sailors will proceed to a lesson, then rig boats and prepare for sailing

Emergency Procedures

- In the case of inclement weather, it may be necessary to send participants and staff home, should it become impossible to provide social distancing at Tuck's Point
- Staff members, including Director, shall wear a face covering when dealing with Sailors who might be injured or need assistance



Boat Use Procedures

- The boat and equipment will be sanitized by the staff prior to the lesson/practice.
- The instructor will supervise the launching of the boat, or the coach will launch the boat for the student if needed.
- If towing out is required, the instructor will work with the sailor to rig the towline and tow the boat out of the harbor.
- At the end of the lesson the sailors must haul the boats onto the float and rinse all equipment.
- After the boat has been rinsed, the coach will disinfect the boat before putting it back into the rotation, storing it, or bringing it to the shop for repair.
- Coaches must clean their coach boat and disinfect all controls after each lesson (or day). They must also make sure the boat has sufficient fuel and is in proper working order.

Chase boats

- 5 chase boats operational at all times
