

Since 2010, NAATE has offered a balanced curriculum for the development of frontline educators and leaders. The Field Modules mirror that balance between the educator's work with students, *Teaching & Learning*, and the educator's work with other adults, Supporting & Leading. Each of the ten Field Modules is comprised of a series of sequential sessions designed to build a deeper understanding of the theories behind and effective practices within that aspect of teaching or of leading. The materials are curated, rooted in research, and oriented toward shifting the mindsets and approaches that educators take into their daily work.

Adaptable FOR REMOTE CONNECTION

NAATE Field Modules were first designed for staff professional development at schools. They require 5-6 participants who work through the discussion-based sessions in sequence. Once the sessions begin, there is no need for a lead facilitator. All of the work is conducted within the hour (with no pre-work), and can be scaled up or down for any group size (simply add more groups of 5-6). NAATE's Field Modules can be used seamlessly in a digital forum, ideal for connecting remotely for deep and meaningful professional development sessions.
