



- Think global warming is NOT happening




Do you think global warming is happening?

- Think global warming is caused mostly by natural changes in the environment




Assuming global warming is happening, do you think it is . . .





Few Americans understand the scientific consensus that human-caused global warming is happening




To the best of your knowledge, what percentage of climate scientists think that human-caused global warming is happening?

Only 29% of Americans are very worried




How worried are you about global warming?





Americans increasingly think global warming is harming people in the United States now




When do you think global warming will start to harm people in the United States?

- Disagree (Strongly/Somewhat)




How much do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I have personally experienced the effects of global warming.

About how often do you hear other people you know (your family, friends, co-workers, etc.) talk about global warming?



Estimated % of adults who are worried about global warming (nat'l avg. 64%), 2023










Estimated % of adults who are worried about global warming (nat'l avg. 64%), 2023












Estimated % of adults who think global warming will harm plants and animals (nat'l avg. 70%), 2023












Estimated % of adults who think global warming will harm people in the US (nat'l avg. 61%), 2023












Estimated % of adults who think global warming will harm them personally (nat'l avg. 46%), 2023

Global Warming's Six Americas, Fall 2023 Base: 1,033 U.S. adults Lowest Belief in Global Warming Least Concerned Least Motivated








"If you could ask an expert on global warming one question, what question would you ask?"



Global Warming's Six Americas Over the Last Decade






