Of course illegal downloading and streaming are very popular , but deprives the many people who worked to make a film of the compensation they deserve for their blood, sweat and tears. In addition, the options available can often be of poor quality and you run the risk of infecting your computer or mobile device with a virus if you don't know what you're doing. The amount of content crackle offers is also thinner than subscription services, as the site doesn't have the financial muscles to make purchases of giant content like the larger sites, so it can be harder to find your favorite movie. The downside to an online streaming service is that you are at the mercy of the content that the company has available to You can't just choose any movie under the sun and be guaranteed to be able to watch it. You also don't own the movies, so if Netflix gets rid of your favorite movie you'll find unable to see him. Download A way to have movies and watch them online is to download them. Whether you're a Fan of Google or Apple, both iTunes and the Google Play store offer movies to buy through the accounts that become yours. The new releases cost about \$20; about the same price as a DVD would cost, although a digital copy cannot be lost or damaged. Of course buying individual titles to own is more expensive than paying the small fee for a streaming service and having access to content. Both iTunes and Google Play also offer movies to rent for a lower price. Renting gives you the chance to watch the movie once in a period of 30 days and 24 hours to finish it after clicking play. These options are also great for switching between devices, because iTunes and Google Play will remind you where you are in a movie if you're interrupted and want to switch from your tv to your tablet or smartphone. Amazon offers movies to buy or rent at prices similar to Apple and Google, and you don't need a Prime subscription to access that service. Additional guides The great players Sony Crackle, Crackle or Crackle Plus Once known simply as Crackle, this free streaming site has undergone almost as many name changes as P. Diddy. Initially controlled by Sony, it is now a joint venture between Sony and Chicken Soup for Soul Entertainment (CSS). This partnership created a new entity called Crackle Plus, and it was believed that this would also become the name of the streaming service. However, a look at the site and of course simplicity won: It's just called crackle. Either way, the service includes content from six ad-supported CSS streaming services (Popcornflix, Popcornflix Kids, Popcornflix Comedy, Frightpix, Españolflix and Trull), as well as some Sony movies and television shows. You'll find some low-budget quality hits like Election, Bernie, Coneheads and to Busan, and a generous smattering of obscure but interesting B-movies. Crackle is a great resource, although the constant advertisers can age very quickly. The service is offered in 21 countries, but has ended its Canadian, Latin American and Australian offerings. IMDb TV Latest for this roundup is the IMDb TV owned by Amazon (formerly known as Freevide). It has free TV shows and movies and ads supported. In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to more than 20 Disney series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm in the Middle and My So-Called Life. It's also the only website that lets you stream Lost and Malcolm in the Middle for free. Other TV shows in his relatively small library include Psych, White Collar, 3rd Rock From the Sun, and Schitt's Creek. It has a number of successful films including the Hunger Games series, Groundhog Day, Dog Island, Bigfish, Rudy, Glory, and many other award winners and cult classics. You can watch IMDb TV on the web, Amazon Fire devices and Apple TV, and through the Amazon Prime app you can find on many Smart TVs, tablets and phones. IMDb TV is only for the US for now, although a European expansion is underway. Voodoo, owned by Voodoo Walmart, may be best known for its pay streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive, free ad-supported content section. Titles like Ella Enchanted, The Preacher's Wife and The Hangover Games are good examples of what you'll find. If you cruise through the 4K/HDR title site selection, there are up to one or two free-to-watch options. You'll still need a Voodoo account, but you can create one for free. The Voodoo app is already supported by many platforms, including Roku, Apple TV, game consoles and more. In addition, there is an app for most mobile devices. Voodoo is only available in the US. How's it for a good deal: Sign up for a library card and get free downloads or movie streams without ads. That's the deal when you use Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that has partnered with local libraries to allow members to access content borrowed online. It's similar to Overdrive, but with more than just e-books and audiobooks. The availability of any title will depend on your location and the number of copies available for download, but we found some surprisingly decent movies when we checked in October 2020. Streaming will work on any device with a browser, while downloads require the Hoopla app on a mobile device. Not all libraries support Hoopla, so be sure to ask. So far, libraries in the U.S. and Canada have access to Hoopla. YouTube This is easy. Everyone knows that YouTube is the largest video hosting service and you probably already use the site for silly cat videos and images of people being hit with exercise balls. But YouTube has a considerable collection of feature films on its free level as well. It is certain that most are novelties of list B, but there are some quality movies hidden there. In addition to Google's curated free movies, there are thousands of movies on the site that won't appear unless you search directly for them. If you're looking for a specific title, especially an older one, it's worth doing a quick search on YouTube to see if anyone has posted it. These are not always uploaded by the film's rights holders, and many of them are divided into episodes and playlists, but as they say, beggars cannot be chosen. Finding free movies on YouTube has gotten harder lately, as more rights holders are choosing to offer their movies for rent through the service, and YouTube also has subscription layers like YouTube Premium and its live TV streaming service, YouTube TV. Still, you'll find plenty to watch, especially if your standards aren't too high in terms of flow quality. Vimeo YouTube may be the largest video hosting site, but Vimeo is probably the best. Yes, they are words of struggle, but Vimeo has the muscle to support them. The site has a clean layout that is devoid of ads and benefits from a community of active users that is widely considered more professional and constructive than that of YouTube. From this community emerges a lot of great original shorts and feature films. Vimeo also has an On Demand section where users can buy movies and television shows. Most of them are produced independently by Vimeo users, but some offerings are also produced by major studios. Anyway, Vimeo is a great place to find free and high quality movies. The Roku Channel When roku initially launched its free, ad-supported Roku channel, it was not technically eligible for this roundup because you had to have one of the company's streaming media devices to see it. Roku devices certainly won't break the bank, but they're not free. Now, however, the Roku Channel is available to anyone, via the web, as well as through the company's free apps for iOS and Android. The service has more than 10,000 titles to choose from, including old favorites such as The Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants and Donnie Darko, as well as a new and old TV series from The Dick Van Dyke Show and Bewitched to The Bachelorette. You'll need to create a free Roku account before you can watch, but this is a quick and painless process. If you decide to expand your options, Roku Channel now houses several premium subscription options, including Showtime, Epix, and Starz. The Roku Channel is available in the U.S. and Canada. Free Plex Movies and TV Shows Plex is best known as a versatile and easy way to manage and watch your private collection of movies, music, photos other media. However, in 2019, the company launched its own ad-supported free streaming service with a collection of movies and TV shows from studios such as MGM, MGM, Lionsgate and Legendary. It is available globally, although the selection of titles varies greatly by region. You can access the collection of movies and programs from a browser, or on any of the large devices that support Plex client software, such as Apple TV, Roku, smart TVs, etc. All you need is a free plex account and you're ready to go. For those who already use Plex as their media server, ad-supported free options can be added to existing server categories, making the experience completely seamless. Pluto TV Although not as well known as the above services, Pluto TV still deserves your attention. Not only hosts free movies on demand, but it's also a free live TV streaming service, hosting curated content from across the web. While channels vary wildly, we're focused here on movies. Pluto TV currently has several live movie channels, perfect if you want to watch something but don't know what. There are two general purpose movie channels, with the rest being focused on specific genres or categories, including action films, fury films, 24/7 horror, classic films, black cinema, gravitas films and asylum. The service operates in the U.s as well as in many international locations. Pluto TV's on-demand film library is relatively small and rotates frequently, but offers as much variety as its live movie channels. It's also available on a ton of devices in addition to your computer, including Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Roku devices and more. To learn more about Pluto TV, see our full service guide. Tubi TV Another up-and-comer, Tubi is very similar to Sony Crackle, in its formation of free movies and TV episodes. No matter which device you use, chances are very good that you can watch Tubi, as it is available on Android, iOS, Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Samsung Smart TVs, Sony Smart TVs, PlayStation 4, Xbox One and web. As with the vast majority of services on this list, you'll need to watch some commercials, but that's what keeps the service free. Tubi has content from more than 200 partners, including NBCUniversal and Warner Bros., which carries nearly 400 classic titles such as Hell's Kitchen, Unsolved Mysteries, 3rd Rock From the Sun and The Real McCoys, and the original version of 21 Jump Street. Hit films like Kick-Ass, Fury and 13 Going On 30 are there, as well as cult classics like 30 Days of Night, Donnie Darko, and The Boondock Saints. Cult classics like Assault on Precinct 13, Sleepaway Camp and C.H.U.D., along with soon-to-be cult classics such as 10 Cloverfield Lane and No Country for Old Men, can also be found in the growing catalog. If you're using this service to supplement Netflix instead of replacing it, the Not on Netflix section will help you find new and interesting movies to watch. Independent and Kanopy movies Just like Hoopla, Kanopy is not only free to use, but is also free of commercials if you have a library card. Originally founded in 2008 in Australia as an educational tool, Kanopy now offers a library of over 30,000 films through its partnerships with more than 200 libraries. There is a big focus on independent free films and documentaries (the company still has access to many recent films from the A24 catalog), but you'll find all kinds of films available, and even more are on the way thanks to an agreement that will see filmmaker Fred Wiseman's entire catalog coming to the service. Kanopy is available internationally, but content may vary by location. Top documentary films Do I love documentaries? And so do we. You know what they say, the truth is stranger than fiction. The aptly titled Top Documentary Films is, hand in hand, the best documentary site. Not every selection is long, but a good documentary doesn't have to be long—some of the best are below the 60-minute mark. With a library of over 3,000 documentaries, the site also has a simple and simple layout and categorizes all your movies based on the subject, making it easy to find something you're immediately interested in. The content is not hosted by the site, but rather curated and embedded from other sites such as YouTube, Vimeo, Daily Motion, etc. It's available internationally, but not all content will work in all locations. Classic movie sources Archive.org Chances are, you are reading this article because you are looking for a place to watch newly released movies online. While there's nothing wrong with that, you definitely shouldn't ignore all the older fantastic movies that the internet has to offer. Archive.org offers a real treasure trove of old movies that you've probably never heard of, as well as a handful that you'll recognize. The Archive —which is also home to the famous Wayback Machine that shows how the internet used to be—has silent films, black-and-white horror films, obscure science fiction films, and a variety of other films. They may not have all the chic CGI that we all get used to, but the occasional throwback is a great way to mix things up. Open Culture Open Culture is designed to be your unique store for all things free and cultured. The site offers hundreds of free online classes to sign up, thousands of free ebooks to read, and hours after hours of lectures from prominent figures like Carl Sagan and Leonard Bernstein. It also offers a ton of free movies. Here you'll find everything from silent films and Hitchcock-directed projects to westerns and noir movies. The place even houses some old shorts of legends like Quentin and Stanley Kubrick. Open Culture can be hard to navigate, but with over 1,000 free movies available, it's definitely worth it. Retrovision Retrovision is another public domain site that features hundreds of classic films from several different eras. The classic word may be in high interpretation — there are some films here that were made as recently as last year, and not all Retrovision films are of high quality — but there's still a lot of good here. Retrovision is also a well designed website that allows users to filter based on gender. It's also not limited to feature films, as there's a robust collection of classic TV shows to choose from. Shocker Internet Drive-In Shocker Internet Drive-In Internet Drive-In is a bit niche, and its site looks like it was made in the 90s, but it's a great resource. The site is updated weekly with featured horror classics, which are made available for free download as WMV files in the site's Snack Bar. The site is a fun blast from the past, with weekly displays framed in a digital drive-in. Users can also purchase DVD copies of any movie on the site for a mere \$3. If you miss the old days of the internet when it was more like the Wild West and everything was less polished, this could be for you. The disadvantage of so many different services being available is that if you have a movie in mind but don't know where to watch it, you have a lot of different catalogs to go through hoping to find it. Fortunately, as long as you have a smartphone, you probably have access to a tool that can help you. Apple's TV app, which is available on iOS as well as on several other platforms including Apple TV, Roku, Amazon Fire TV, plus smart LG and Samsung TVs, allows you to search on more than 50 different streaming services. For Android users, the Google Play Movies & TV app offers similar functionality, although the number of connected services is smaller. Roku devices now have a Featured Free section that offers a curated selection of the best free content on the platform, whether you have a specific channel installed or not. This adds up to your existing cross-service search, although most of what you'll find will be available for purchase or rental or will be on a service that requires a subscription.
