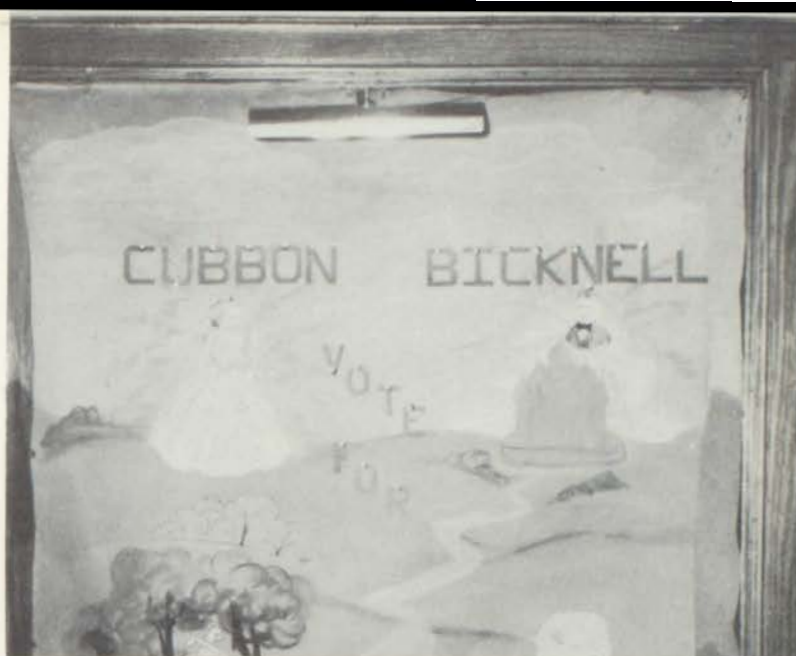
### BRADFORD GARDINIER
