Characteristics of light pdf

When light travels its path through space, it often meets in one form or another of matter. We should all feel the reflection, because we see bright reflections when light hits a smooth shiny surface like a mirror. This is an example of light interacting with matter in a certain way. When light travels from one medium to another, the light bends. This is called folding. If the medium, in the path of light, bends light or blocks certain frequencies of it, we can see separate colors. For example, a rainbow occurs when the light of the sun is distinguished by moisture in the air. Humidity bends light, which separates frequencies and allows us to see the unique colors of the light spectrum. Prisms also offer this effect. When light hits the prism at certain angles, the light is reflected (bends) so that it is separated into its individual frequencies. This effect is due to the shape of the prism and the angle of light. If you look closely at what happens when a light wave enters the prism in another diagram, you'll notice that it bends down. This bending occurs because light travels faster in the air than through the prism. When the lower part of the wave enters the prism, it slows down. Since the upper part of the wave (still in the air) travels faster than the lower part, the wave bends. Similarly, when the wave exits the prism, the upper part exits first and begins to travel faster than the lower part, which is still in the prism. This speed difference will make the wave bend again. Think of the skateboard rider who goes into the driveway. If the rider turns and goes into the grass, his body will plunge forward and really fly off the board if he travels fast enough in the first place. This corresponds to the bending of light, as it passes through different media. The skateboard and rider move at the same speed until the wheels hit the lawn. Now suddenly the skateboard runs slower than the rider, so the rider starts bending forward (the rider tries to keep going at the same speed as before the wheels hit the grass).
