8/4/12		<p>Interstate 5 in Whatcom County was completely shut down for two hours after reports that someone with a rifle was firing shots from an overpass Saturday night. It started around 10:15 p.m. at the overpass at Smith Road (I-5 mp 261.52). Whatcom County Sheriff's Office Sgt. Kevin Mede said a Ferndale Police officer responded and saw shots being fired over the northbound lanes. Officers from Whatcom County, Ferndale and Bellingham police departments, Washington State Patrol and the Border Patrol all responded, some wearing bulletproof vests and armed with assault rifles.</p> <p>Despite an air and ground search that included K-9s and a helicopter, the shooter was able to get away. He was only described as a male with dark clothing on. No people or cars were reported hit by gunfire. I-5 was reopened around 12:15 a.m.</p> <p>Anyone who saw something suspicious in the area Saturday night is asked to call police.</p> <p>JH</p>

"There is no guarantee that anyone was actually shooting from the overpass. No witness actually saw shots fired, but someone traveling on I-5 thought they may have seen someone in a black hoodie carrying a rifle. They did not see shots fired. No other evidence, like shell casings, have been found around the scene that might help indicate shots having been fired," the statement said. I-5 was closed in both directions for about 2 hours Saturday night while police from multiple agencies searched for signs of a shooter. Police are asking anyone who may have more information about the incident to call 911 ask to be connected to Ferndale PD (Tom)</p>

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1/7/12		<p>Alcoa to restart Ferndale's Intalco, 2 other smelting lines by Associated Press Posted on January 7, 2011 at 11:35 AM</p> <p>NEW YORK - Aluminum maker Alcoa said Friday it plans to restart three idled U.S. smelters, bringing back about 260 laid-off workers and hiring some new ones. Potlines will be restarted at the Massena East facility in Massena, N.Y.; Wenatchee Works in Malaga, Wash.; and Intalco in Ferndale, Wash., the company said in a statement. Alcoa said it would recall 95 laid-off workers and hire another 165 employees for the plants. The restarts, which already have begun, will help Alcoa meet expected growth in aluminum demand, and it will meet obligations to power companies in long-term, low-cost contracts, Alcoa's statement said.</p> <p>Power rates at Wenatchee and Massena are about 40 percent less than worldwide averages, the company said. The restarts will be powered by hydroelectric power.</p> <p>"We are pleased to bring jobs back and increase our economic impact in each of these communities," said Bob Wilt, president of Alcoa's U.S. primary products. "We believe this additional capacity will be absorbed in the market as Alcoa meets rising demand for light, strong and recyclable aluminum from customers around the world."</p> <p>The restarts should be finished in the first half of the year. After completion, Alcoa still will have 674,000 metric tons of idle factory capacity, the company's statement said. (Tom)</p>
